






I was blown away by the attention to detail throughout the set!

The park was the fourth national park established in the world. The active volcanic mountains Ruapehu, Ngauruhoe, and Tongariro are located in the center of this park.








Typical volcanic soil around the still active volcanoes.





The following scenes were taken along the way to Milford Sound. The one above is part of the <u>Remarkables</u> mountain range outside of Queenstown.











The jewel location of our trip to New Zealand was a cruise tour of the <u>UNESCO World Heritage site</u>, <u>Milford Sound</u>. It is located on the southwest of South Island in <u>Fiordland National Park</u>. The 16 kilometer length from the head of the fiord to the open sea is lined with sheer rock faces that soar 1,200 meters high from the water. It is often called one of the most beautiful places on Earth! AND, there were several "Lord Of The Rings" <u>filming locations</u> in and near the park!







It has also been judged the world's top travel destination in an international survey (the 2008 Travelers' Choice Destinations Awards by TripAdvisor) and is acclaimed as New Zealand's most famous tourist destination. Rudyard Kipling had previously called it the eighth Wonder of the World!





It is easy to see that waterfalls can be found throughout the park, especially on rainy days. It rains most of the time here and the park often will close as a result of treacherous weather. We were lucky the day we went. It poured on the way there, but the sun did break out a few times with patches of blue sky!









We were fortunate to see some seals resting on the rocks.























The prettiest city we visited was <u>Queenstown</u>. The town is built around an inlet called Queenstown Bay on Lake Wakatipu, a long thin Z-shaped lake formed by glacial processes, and has views of nearby mountains such as The Remarkables, Cecil Peak, Walter Peak and just above the town, Ben Lomond and Queenstown Hill.

Water and mountains, what a combination! It is a great location to do "spokes of the wheel" touring to many scenic locations.



















<u>Glenorchy</u> is a small settlement at the northern end of <u>Lake Wakatipu</u>. The local scenery was used as one of the settings in the first of Peter Jackson's "The Fellowship of the Ring" (2001), the first film in his Lord of the Rings series. Lothlórien, Orthanc, and the scene where Boromir was slain and leant near a tree were a few that were shot in nearby <u>Paradise</u>. It was also used in "The Hobbit" trilogy, for scenes of the exterior of Beorn's house. I always knew I would one day make it to Paradise!

My Artistic Mission

Child-like wonder and inquisitiveness

I believe we all need to re-connect with these qualities to reenrich our lives. A first glance at a photograph of an onion often reveals the fact that, indeed, it is an onion. But what also lies beneath its surface? We won't know until we peel back its layers.

Animation innovator, Walt Disney, recognized this and tried to bring back the power and importance of imagination. Inspired by his spirit, my mission therefore is to encourage the use of viewer imagination. My work attempts to explore and suggest what often lies hidden within the personalities and mysteries present in the world that was, and the world that is around us.


For me, my photography often is not so much about the decisive moment. Rather, it is about creating an awareness of place and a sense of history, with an aura of mystery. It is the starting point for my artistic journey, not the destination. I try to use what I produce

as personal metaphors for my reactions to what I saw and felt. My favorite motivational quote is that "Life begins at the edge of your comfort zone." My works attempt to reflect this as I probe the emotional, mind's eye after-image that was captured by both the eye and the heart, and which often defies logical explanation by the mind.

My goal is that my projects will serve as a springboard into inventiveness and exploration with the hopes of awakening my viewer's inner child. I try hard to show the connections and implications of things that others may not readily see. My hope is that my work may also help viewers discover the beginnings of their attempt to understand and perhaps even learn to tolerate and sympathize with the human condition and the world in which we live. I will try to do whatever I can to make viewers linger longer in front of my works so as to ignite their imaginative response through discovery and inquisitiveness.
