LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

Dear friends,

As President of the Shepherd Fund it is my pleasure to share with you an overview of events for the coming season and provide news from behind the scenes of our organization. Meeting almost weekly throughout the year, I work closely with our Artistic Director, Estrid Eklof and our Vice President, Raymond Petke, on program planning and general operations. Key to every decision we make is the financial health of our small budget. We are especially thankful to all involved in the Fund's life who volunteer their time and energy. This allows for all finances to be completely invested in the presentation and funding of our artists.

Our scheduled events span three seasons. This season begins in October with an organ "informance" spotlighting the Collinsville Congregation Church's famed Flentrop instrument. For the seventh consecutive year our "Joyous Music" ensemble, Quodlibet, returns in December. Spring 2016 will be ushered in with a spirited early music concert and with our annual invitational exhibition of visual delights. Two families will open the doors of their beautiful homes, one offering a celebratory evening of jazz and poetry and the other the intimacy of a private recital given by an internationally acclaimed pianist. We look forward to meeting and greeting you all at our events.

Central to our existence is the dedicated board of directors. We have had two changes in our board this past year. After serving as the Fund's first Financial Advisor, Dennis Cardello has stepped down. We would like to thank Dennis for his expertise and leadership. He will continue to contribute to the Fund as a member of our Shepherd Circle. Our Legal Advisor, Walt Hampton has also also left the board. Walt served many years and we are appreciative of his insight and guidance. We welcome two new members of the board, Financial Advisor Kristin Oswald and Legal Advisor Michael Freeman. Kristin is a prominent leader in the business life of the Canton community and also manages her own business in financial planning. Michael brings his experience from many years in corporate legal work and continues to practice privately, providing legal services, especially in the area of entertainment law.

One of the great treasures of the Collinsville Congregational Church, and indeed of the east coast of the country, is the organ built by famed Dutch organ maker Dirk Flentrop (1910–2003). We are thrilled to

welcome Christa Rakich, renowned organist and harpsichordist, who will give an "informance", a combined recital and talk about the Flentrop organ and the music on her program.

Ms. Rakich is currently director of the musical program at St. Mark the Evangelist Church in West Hartford, Connecticut and Artist-in-Residence at First Congregational Church in Somers, Connecticut. As a Fulbright Scholar she studied for two years with Anton Heiller at the Hochschule für Musik in Vienna. She has held



teaching posts at the New England Conservatory, Westminster Choir College, Brandeis University and the University of Connecticut. Her performing career has taken her throughout North American and Europe and included a series of thirty-four concerts of the complete keyboard music of J. S. Bach.

The Sebastians are in their fourth year as Ensemble-in-Residence at All Angels' Church in Manhattan. The group has been featured at the Connecticut Early Music Festival and with New York's dell'Arte Opera. As well as

LOOKING BACK: EVENTS FROM OUR PAST SEASON

American cellist Jacques Lee Wood and Australian guitarist Simon Powis opened

the 2014-2015 Shepherd Music Series at Collinsville Congregational Church with a combined duo and solo concert on Sunday, November 9, 2014 at 4:00 p.m. Their program included works by Johann Sebastian Bach, Friedrich Burgmüller, Reynaldo Hahn, Franz Schubert, Arvo Pärt, Gaspar Cassadó, Manuel de Falla, and Radames Gnattali. The duo had recently



launched its debut CD, Paperworks, with a five concert tour of China. The concert was followed by a reception in the church's Collins Hall.

The Quodlibet Ensemble presented the Fund's traditional winter celebratory concert, Music for a Joyous Season, held on Sunday, December 14, 2014, 4:00 p. m. as part of the Shepherd Music Series at Collinsville Congregational Church. Returning for its sixth consecutive winter performance, works by Arcangelo Corelli, George Frederick Handel, Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart and Antonio Vivaldi were enjoyed. The concert had an overflow crowd with additional seating brought in to accommodate the more than two-hundred and fifty guests. Even the organ bench in the balcony section was employed to seat the enthusiastic audience. A festive reception was held in Collins Hall following the performance.

Our long and severe winter was warmed by the return visit of the celebrated Spanish pianist Juan Carlos Fernandez-Nieto for a Sunday, February 22, 2015, 4:00 p.m. recital for the Shepherd Music Series at Collinsville Congregational Church. His program included works by Johann Sebastian Bach, Wolfgang

Amadeus Mozart, Robert Schumann and a selection from Iberia, by countryman Isaac Albéniz. After a standing ovation, members of the audience and the artist attended a reception in Collins Hall. By coincidence, Juan Carlos Fernandez-Nieto gave his debut recital with the Fund exactly five years ago to the day (February 22). On both occasions the day's



weather was challenging with intermittent snow and ice. And on both occasions the Collinsville Congregational Church was packed.

The Annual Maxwell Shepherd Memorial Invitational Exhibition at the Gallery on the Green featured painting and sculpture by the internationally-acclaimed artist Peter Waite. The exhibition was held from Friday, April 24 to May 24, 2015. An opening reception took place on Saturday, April, 25 from 6:00 to 9:00 p.m.

and was attended by over two-hundred and fifty people. The artist himself was unable to attend, being engaged at the same time by a major exhibition of his Cincinnati Series at the Carl Solway Gallery in Cincinnati. However, Peter was on hand Sunday, May, 3 at the Gallery on the Green to give an informal talk and to meet visitors at a post-talk reception.



The concluding performance of the 2014-2015 Shepherd Music Series at Collinsville Congregational Church was held on Saturday, May 16, 2015 at 7:00 p.m. and presented the piano and percussion duo Synchronicity. Brothers Garah Landes, piano and Gregory Landes, percussion brought their fusion of classical and jazz music to life with an innovative program that included their own transcriptions of works by Béla Bartók and Alberto Ginastera, solo works by Johann Sebastian Bach and Enrique Granados, as well as three newly commissioned works by jazz artists Steve Kenyon, Jeremy Beck, and Rory Stuart. The audience was mesmerized by the complexity and variety of the music and showed their appreciation with a spontaneous standing ovation.

ARTISTS UPDATES

Artist **Peter Waite** had a solo exhibition of his Cincinnati Series at the Carl Solway Gallery in Cincinnati from April 24 to August 1, 2015.

The Claremont Trio (Andrea Lam, piano; Emily Bruskin, violin; Julia Bruskin, cello) gave concerts at The Gardner Museum in Boston in January and April 2015 and at The Library of Congress in Washington, DC. in February 2015.

Pianist Ryo Yanagitani is Artist-in-Residence and Artistic Advisor to the Overtures Artists Concert Series since 2013 at the S&R Foundation in Washington, DC. He continues to give concerts with the S&R Foundation's Evermay Chamber Orchestra and the combined Baltimore Symphony Orchestra and S & R Chamber Ensemble. Ryo also gave a solo recital of music by Rachmaninov in May 2015 and presented a discussion and solo performance on WUSA 9 television in September 2014.

Stephen Collins, the Boston-area actor, lecturer, and historical tour guide, presented "Irish Voices", a dramatic reading of works by Yeats, Joyce, Heaney, McCourt and others, at the Southbury Connecticut United Church of Christ's Arts Escape on Saint Patrick's Day 2015.

The Amphion String Quartet (Katie Hun, violin; David Southorn, violin; Wie-Yang Andy Lin, viola; Mihai Marica, cello), members of the Chamber Music Society at Lincoln Center's CMS Two Program, gave several concerts in the past year including those at BargeMusic in Brooklyn New York; the Chamber Music Society at Lincoln Center New York; the Van Cliburn Festival Fort Worth, Texas; and a collaboration with the members of the BodyVox

dance company in Portland, Oregon. The quartet's first CD recorded in 2014 on Nimbus Records was hailed by MusicWeb International, "...the

playing of the Amphion String Quartet is remarkably mature and displays impeccable intonation, unity and glorious musicality".

Organist Ahreum Han, Principal Organist, Assistant Director of Music, and Artist-in-Residence at First Presbyterian Church in Davenport, Iowa, maintains an active concert schedule that saw her give recitals at the Cathedral of St. John the Divine in New York and at Trinity Church in New Haven, Connecticut. This September she will perform at the Evangelische Kirchgemeinde in Arbon, Switzerland. Ahreum has also been named as College Organist at Cornell College in Mount Vernon, Iowa.

Artist Robert Andrew Parker had an exhibition of his World War II watercolors at the Arkansas Art Center in February and March 2015. A selection of his illustrations was also included in a group show on illustrated visual journalism at the Kemper Art Museum, Washington University in St. Louis.

Soprano Lucy Fitz Gibbon, soloist with the Quodlibet Ensemble in December 2012, was soloist with the Tulsa Symphony in a performance of Mozart's Requiem in January 2015. In February 2015 she sang the role of Dianora in Max von Schilling's opera Mona Lisa with the American Symphony Orchestra at Carnegie Hall. This summer she was a fellow at the Tanglewood Music Center for the second consecutive year.

The Jasper String Quartet, Quartet-in-Residence at Temple University's Center for Gifted Young Musicians, has begun its two-year worldwide engagement to premiere Aaron J. Kernis' Third String Quartet, a work that the quartet commissioned. So far the Kernis quartet has had premieres at Chamber Music Northwest in Portland, Oregon and at the Karamoor Center for Music and the Arts in Katonah. New York.

Artist **Robert Dente** is included in a group show, running from June to September 2015, at Brick Walk Fine Art in West Hartford. The show "celebrates the light and heat of summer".

The Jupiter String Quartet, Quartet-in-Residence at the University of Illinois in Champaign-Urbana, was featured in the summer 2015 Chamber Music Festivals in Rockport, Maine and Cape Cod as well as the Music Festival in Aspen, Colorado. Their most recent recording, "Ravel: Intimate Masterpieces", with harpist Yolanda Kondonassis was hailed by American Record Guide as "a must-have...the recording of Ravel's String Quartet by Jupiter tops them all".

Curator, exhibition director, and artist **Richard Klein** was the juror for the exhibition "Open Call NNE (North Northeast)" held January and February 2015 at the Brattleboro Museum of Art in Vermont.

The Modigliani String Quartet continues their busy career with a three-week tour of Australia in October 2015 and a ten-day tour of Japan in November 2015. The past six months have seen the quartet on a tour of North America, including a concert at Carnegie Hall. Their collaboration with the recording company Mirare has produced five award-winning CDs.

"Deep Lane", the latest book of poems by Mark Doty, has been published by W. W. Norton. Doty has another publication forthcoming, "What is the Grass?", a personal rumination on Walt Whitman. Many of our dedicated followers will recall that the Fund commissioned Mark Doty for five poems that were part of "Museum Garden", our first event,

. Soprano Awet Andemicael was guest soloists with the Sebastians in May 2015 for a concert of sacred and secular music by Handel and Vivaldi. This past summer she performed with the cutting-edge orchestral ensemble The Knights at Tanglewood's Seiji Ozawa Hall and at New York's Bryant Park. This autumn she will be Visiting Lecturer of Sacred Music at Yale University's Institute for Sacred Music.
